And Garland emphasized the beat, an important part of playing those early century songs. Our next first-halfer, Ivan Klitgaard, played polkas, one of which was the Too Fat Polka. He also played a jazz piece called Twelfth Street Rag. As he played other pieces he emphasized the notes so that we could remember the tunes and at least hum them, or even sing them. Our third first-half player, Bob Stanfield, played Helena Polka and Swing Low Sweet Chariot. Bob really likes Scott Joplin music so he played a piece called The Easy Winners. Then he took us to Switzerland by putting us In the Tyrolean Alps. He knows when to pause to promote the feeling and charms that draw us to each melody. And Paul and Leah Powers danced to some of what Bob played.
