After hearing Joe Schmiel play his "button box," he became interested and took lessons from him. All his music has been hand written by Joe Schmiel. Hermann also practices two hours a day. Practice, practice, practice, and then practice more.

Bill Likens from the Norwegian group played a few Irish and German tunes for us on his Fisman accordion. It has a wood veneer finish and a pleasant sound. His accordion has 4 small speakers on the bass side. It has a set of lower bass reeds and is made for Alpine music. Bill started when he was 13 years old. He plays in a German band and two Irish bands, practices with groups three times a week, and is an accomplished musician.

Nordahl Grieg Leikarring og Spelemannslag put on a stunning performance. Spelemannslag, the musician part was made up of our own Bob Stanfield and Bill Likens on accordions , and Birgit Calhouon on the recorder. Erik Gjovaag played one tune on a unique violin, which had 5 extra strings built inside, while the remainder of the group danced to his music. They played standing for over an hour and a half. Bob started learning the music in June, when he joined the group. He MUST practice 2 hours a day like Reno and Hermann.

The Leikarring are the Norwegian folk dancers. There were 10 couples. Everyone was very light on the feet. It was obvious that they enjoyed dancing and showing us their heritage. They handle the small space very well.

Meg Laycock, their dance leader, told us about their beautiful costumes which are regulated by the government of Norway. The various costumes depict the different regions of Norway. The mining area had copper buttons; there were areas that had lots of lace, and some that had unique hats, buckle shoes, and jewelry. One couple had the Scottish influence. The Norwegians ran the Scots off but kept their red blade. There was one couple from Sweden in their native dress. Three hundred years ago they too were Norwegians.

At the end of the performance a couple of folk dances were taught to SVAS participants. It made for a mighty full dance floor. What a fun afternoon we all had!


